Treasurer's Report – Leslie Hoolaeff

- Leslie shared the proposed 2023/2024 budget spreadsheet for the group to review. This budget was also shared in the meeting agenda sent out before the meeting.
- Capital Expense spending request
 - Leslie outlined a list of tech requests from the school that would be taken out of the Capital Funds account. The account currently has \$50,000. The proposed list costs \$23,720.00 Leaving the account with \$27,263.16 if approved.
 - o Request is for iPads, iPad cart, iPad keyboards, Ozobots, Lego robotics.
 - Lots of questions about how the items would be used/access used in classrooms by teachers (all grades) as the cart can be moved from classroom to classroom, teachers work out a usage system, Ms.
 Mochrie currently does lots of coding in the library,
 - After the discussion and questions
- Motion to approve \$23, 720 for the proposed tech package
 - o 92% yes, 8% no
 - Motion is passed
- Review of Proposed 2023/2024 budget
 - o Review now and vote will be taken at June meeting on the budget
 - Leslie talked the group through every line item, describing everything please see the following link of more details.
